Script Guidance for Net Control Operators

- Read the script thoroughly before net starts to familiarize yourself with the words and phrasing,
- Have pen and paper at hand to take notes during the net session,
- Read aloud the script words printed in black,
- Do not speak the script titles printed in red,
- Explanatory notes for operators are printed in blue, and are not intended to be read aloud.

I. Open the Net Promptly at 7:30 PM

Good evening and welcome to the Western Placer Amateur Radio Club Net.

This is (your call sign) on the Western Placer Amateur Radio Club K6PAC repeater, located in the foothills above Lincoln, CA, at an elevation of approximately 500 feet. This radio operates on an output frequency of 147.300 MHz with a positive offset of 600 KHz and PL tone of 67.0 Hz.

My name is (your name). I am located in (your city or location) and I will be tonight's net control. (Drop the repeater for 2 seconds. The repeater will time-out and stop transmitting if you transmit for more than 2 minutes without a pause.)

This is a directed net for the purpose of passing information to the membership of the club. Do not transmit unless invited to do so by Net Control. Anyone having emergency or priority traffic may, of course, break-in at any time.

If there are any Officers or Board members who have announcements or business for the Net, please come now with your call sign. (Acknowledge anyone who calls and after they finish their announcement, ask if anyone has any questions. Then ask if there are further announcements.)

As a reminder, we ask club members to turn on their radio during the day, tuned to this repeater, to respond to stations operating on this frequency who may need assistance, or simply wish to communicate with other radio operators.

II. Challenge Question

This is (your call sign). We will now offer this week's challenge question. Questions are randomly drawn from the General test pool. I will read the question and the 4 possible answers.

Please give your answer or guess when you check-in. After all stations have checked-in, I will give the correct answer. (Read the question you selected.)

III. Station Check-in Portion of the Net

This is (your call sign). We will now begin our station check-in portion of the Net. Club members will be called from a list of recent check-ins, along with recent visitors. Please acknowledge your call sign when called. Club members who are not on the list will have a chance to check-in immediately afterwards, and your name will be added to the list. Visitors will also have an opportunity to check-in at that time. Prior to closing the net I will give one final opportunity for any station to check-in who has not already done so. Don't forget to give your answer to the challenge question when you check-in.

Roll call begins now. (Start the roll with the person after your name on the net roster. That way, the same person isn't always the first to be called to answer the question. Drop the repeater, then read down the list of check-ins provided. Jot down any new calls. Acknowledge every check-in.)

This is (your call sign). Are there any late or missed club members who need to check-in? Please come now with your call sign. (Drop the repeater.)

Now, I would like to invite any visitor or guest to check-in to the WPARC Net. When you give your call sign, please use ITU phonetics to make it easier for me to copy your call sign accurately. Also, please give your name and location when you check-in. Visitors and guests, please check-in now. (Drop the repeater. Jot down responses. Acknowledge every check-in.)

The answer to this week's challenge question is: (Read the question and the correct answer.)

IV. Information Sharing and Discussion Portion of the Net

At this time, we will begin the Information Sharing and Discussion portion of our Net. I would like to invite any station to share any Amateur Radio related news such as upcoming contests, events, or activities; equipment you wish to buy, sell, trade, or have recently acquired; technical questions related to Amateur Radio; recent contacts you have made, or other items of interest to Amateur Radio Operators.

Please come now with your call sign. (Acknowledge each station that responds individually and ask if there are any questions following each announcement.)

V. Information Regarding Upcoming Meetings and Events

This club meets at 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of every month at the Round Table Pizza in Rocklin. Information for the location is available on our website, wparc.org.

We also meet at 8:00 AM on the second Saturday of every month at the Waffle Farm in Lincoln for Second Saturday Breakfast. Again, information is available on our website.

In addition, we offer Amateur Radio license testing sessions on the first Tuesday of each month, administered by ARRL Volunteer Examiners.

VI. Drill Messages/Exercise Messages

Learning to convey tactical or record message traffic is an essential skill. Operators must be able to communicate accurately and efficiently, must be able to transcribe information without error, keep concise radio logs, and perform the basic administrative functions required of a message center or EOC.

This portion of tonight's net is dedicated to that goal. Our Club offers practice sending and receiving simulated priority messages using standard prowords, proper ITU phonetics, and concise procedures. [\(Drop the repeater.\)](#)

Any message that follows is only a drill and is not intended for any action. I repeat; any exercise message that follows is only for practice purposes and is not intended for any action.

Any stations that have drill or exercise traffic, please come now with your call sign. [\(Acknowledge each station that responds individually. Allow the Originating station to contact the Receiving station. Monitor the transmission of the message but do not intervene unless a relay process is necessary. When the message is passed successfully, the Originating station will relinquish transmission rights to Net Control. Clear all stations.\)](#)

VII. Closing the Net

This is [\(your call sign\)](#), Net Control for this session of the Western Placer Amateur Radio Club Net. Before I close the net, this is the last call for any station to check-in who has not already done so. Please come now with your call sign. [\(Drop the repeater. Wait for and acknowledge any check-ins.\)](#)

This concludes the Western Placer Amateur Radio Club 2-meter evening net. This net meets weekly at 1930 hours on this K6PAC repeater. Thank you for checking in and participating in tonight's net.
